We are making good progress towards our new building. We met with a planning officer in January who was very supportive of our plans to replace the terrapin with a timber frame, timber clad building. We are going to deliver a questionnaire to every household in the next few weeks so everyone in the village can give us their views on what new services we can usefully provide in the new building.

There are several fund-raising events for the new building planned over the next few months. All details are on the website. On Saturday April 27th there will be a Table Top Sale in the School Hall from 10am to 12 noon. Book a table for £8 in the shop and come along to sell all your unwanted items leaving your house beautifully uncluttered! Or take the opportunity to sell your home-made produce or crafts. #### **BROADBAND UPDATE**

Previously we have told you that the broadband access in the village will be improved when a new fibre to the premises service provided by Gigaclear is installed. The last update we had was that this would be done between the first and third quarters of 2020.

The process is being driven by Fastershire, a partnership between Herefordshire Council and Gloucestershire County Council to bring faster broadband to the two counties.

Due to Gigaclear missing several planned start dates, Fastershire have requested that Gigaclear produce a new deployment plan. This is due to be published at the end of March but isn't available as we go to press.

Nevertheless work is continuing on the roll out and many places in the county are benefiting from the new service. For us it's a matter of watch this space.


