### VILLAGE NEWS

#### **NEW KISSING GATES**

The cover picture shows Sarah and Matt Lorkin at one of the four new kissing gates installed in the village. When they married last year, rather than have a conventional wedding gift list, they wanted to find a local cause to support. After attending a council meeting they realised that replacing some of the stiles in the village with kissing gates was an obvious choice. At 5'1" tall Sarah knows that a stile can be a significant obstacle.

The four new gates are at the end of Norton's Alley (the path from the far right corner of the recreation ground), two more on the path from there up to Haw Street and one off The Street at Pinnells End Lane.

The gates from Nortons Alley allow a stile-free circular walk from the recreation ground, returning to the village centre via Haw Street, Trenley Road and The Street. See the Parish Council's website for a map.

The gates were installed by the Cotswold Voluntary Wardens who work with parish councils, farmers and local residents to help keep footpaths open and identify local features in need of restoration.

This is a wonderful and generous gift and one the village is very grateful for.

#### VILLAGE HALL AGM

The AGM of the Village Hall Management Committee will take place on October 8th (not 9th as in the last Newsletter) at 7.30 pm in the Jubilee Room.

#### **BLOCKED PAVEMENTS**

Pedestrians in the village are having increasing difficulty with blocked pavements.

Parking on the pavement can obstruct and seriously inconvenience pedestrians, people in wheelchairs or with visual impairments and people with prams or pushchairs and exposes them to increased danger if they have to walk in middle of the road to get round the obstruction. The width of the roads in Coaley means that there is no benefit in parking on the pavement because there is still not enough space for two cars to pass at the same time. Please park sensibly with consideration for all other road users.

Overgrown hedges next to footpaths and roads are another problem. They pose a real hazard to people who are disabled or who are visually impaired and young children or other pedestrians who risk injury or damage to their faces or clothing from thorns and branches. If the pavement is narrow or the obstruction is excessive, they may be forced into the road. This is particularly dangerous for wheelchair users or for people pushing a pram or buggy.


#### PRODUCE SHOW

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Firstly I would like to express my thanks for information received regarding suspicious vehicles in the area. I informed the police, who checked them, and could tell me that none were stolen or suspicious, but that our diligence was appreciated.

Any incident you may have to report, please inform the police. Call 101 first as they wish to obtain reports from a first person rather than myself, as was previously the procedure, but I would still appreciate being informed.

You may experience delays on the 101 system, as I did a couple of weeks ago, when I discovered a road accident near the old Church at Frocester. A car had overturned, and was lying on its near side in a ditch, so deeply that it was hardly visible at all from the road.

Due to tinted windows, I was unable to see clearly inside, so could not know whether a person was lying injured inside, or even underneath the vehicle. Despite help from a passing motorist, this could not be established.

Dialling 101, I could not get any reply, so I rang 999, only to be told it was not an emergency. When told of my fears that a person could be trapped, they then took notice.

With the increase of traffic, please exercise extra caution when driving through the village, and especially the roads in and around Betworthy and the Close as I have received several complaints. Speeding in these areas can only result in accidents causing injuries to residents and unsuspecting animals.

Many of you have expressed concerns over the number of cars parked outside the Railway Station, and along Box Rd. I have discussed my concerns on an increasing number of occasions, and cannot understand why nothing has been done to rectify the problem.

Be extra careful with the many scams operating these days, too many to mention. The solution is quite simple.....PUT THE PHONE DOWN.

On Crimewatch this week, the latest fraud is when you receive a visit from a person claiming to be a Police Officer. Be careful...They have false warrant cards, and can be very convincing.

Please continue to report your suspicions of any person or vehicle, and thank-you for your past and hopefully future support.

# Cotswold Country Flowers

For those of you that don't already know, my name is Fiona Porter and I have been trading as Cotswold Country Flowers for 3 seasons now. I grow my own flowers at our home just off the Ham and use them in floristry workshops for beginners, local weddings, bouquet deliveries and I also sell buckets of flowers to event florists and individuals wanting to do their own thing. I have also opened my garden to visitors throughout the summer. Everyone loves coming to Coaley and it really makes me appreciate what a beautiful part of the world we are lucky enough to live in.

I generally provide flowers and services from around May until October apart from a flurry of Christmas wreath workshops and the odd bespoke workshop in the spring.

As I'm approaching the end of the season, there is still plenty that is looking good including dahlias, sunflowers, helychrysum, antirrhinum and statice. I'm also planning ahead for next season with biennials and hardy annuals planted out so they can overwinter and have a head start next season.

As mentioned earlier, my Christmas wreath making workshops are being held in the village hall on Sunday 8th December morning or afternoon but are filling up fast as are places at The Painswick Hotel on Dec 3rd and 10th.
